Minutes of the 15th Meeting of the Steering Committee of Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) held on 20th June, 2018 (Wednesday) at 11:00 a.m. in the Conference Hall (Room No. 602) of MWCD at 6th Floor, A-Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.

- 1. The 15th Meeting of the Steering Committee of Central Adoption Resource Authority, chaired by Shri Rakesh Srivastava, Secretary, MWCD (Chairperson of Steering Committee of CARA), was held on 20th June, 2018 at 11.00 A.M. in the Conference Hall, MWCD, 6th floor, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi-110001.

- 3. At the outset, Chairperson, Steering committee welcomed all the Members of the Committee and asked Member Secretary, Steering Committee/CEO, CARA to start the proceeding of the meeting.
- 4. Member Secretary & CEO, after greeting the Chairperson and Members, informed that the Minutes of the 14th Steering Committee Meeting, duly approved by the Chairperson of the Steering Committee were circulated to all the members and that no comments were received from any member, the minutes as such were taken as confirmed.
- 5. Prior to the discussion on the update of the ATR on the discussion/decisions taken in the last meeting, JS & FA, MWCD opined that as per section 69 (3) (c) of the Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2015, the Steering Committee should adopt the service rules, financial rules of authority as well as the other regulations for the exercise of the administrative and programmatic powers within the organisation, with the prior approval of the Central Government. The rules, regulations and Bye laws including the financial rules are yet to be approved by the Ministry as mandated in the Act. Further, previous decision of the Steering Committee to continue the present Service Bye Laws of CARA also needs the approval of the Ministry. Member Secretary & CEO-CARA informed that the draft revised Rules and Regulation of CARA

formulated by a Committee ordered by Secretary, WCD which had members from MWCD and IFD has already been submitted to the Ministry vide letter no.A12024/1/2017/Admn-CARA dated 17.07.2017 and is under consideration. Further, the file for approval to continue the present Service Bye Laws of CARA till such time revised Rules and Regulations of CARA is approved is also under consideration of the Ministry. JS (ASK) informed that Ministry will take up the matter on urgent basis, till such time Steering Committee may approve the financial matters on the basis of existing Service Bye Laws of CARA.

It was informed that CARA has empanelled M/s. Luminous Infoways Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi for Hiring of Technical Staff for CARINGS project of CARA for a period of one year w.e.f. 01/06/2018 to 31/05/2019 through open tender process as per the GFR.

NIC expressed the requirement for revamping the CARINGS which was supported by the CEO. It was suggested that a proposal for the same be initiated.

Item No. 4: Ratification of Purchase of Computers and Desktops under Plan Head.

Complied with as approved.

Item No. 5(A): Dissemination of Video Spots Through UFO in the Movie Halls.

The Proposal is already moved in eoffice and is under consideration.

Item No. 5(B): Single Female PAP in Live-in Relation with a Male in USA.

It was informed that the Steering Committee through its meeting dated 10/05/2018 decided that, the children should be entrusted with a

stable family. Since, single PAP with a live-in-partner does not entail a stable relationship. The decision has been taken in line with Section 57 of the JJ Act, 2015 and Regulation 5(3) of Adoption Regulations, 2017.

In this regard, a circular has been issued to all the AFAAs and Central Authorities/ concerned Indian Diplomatic Missions vide circular no. CARA-ICA012/3/2017 dated 31/05/2018. The same is also uploaded at Circular page on the Website of CARA.

Item No. 5(C): Proposal for Strengthening of CARA.

It was informed that the proposal has been moved to the Ministry on 11th June, 2018 (File No. A-12024/2/2018/Rest/Admn-CARA).

Item No. 5(D): Re-constitution of Advisory Committee of CARA.

It was informed that the Advisory Committee of CARA has been reconstituted at national level vide OM CW-II-26/9/2016-CW-II dated 28th May 2018 to promote adoption of OAS children in the country. As per the directions of Hon'ble Minister WCD, the Advisory Committee has expanded with 24 Members including a chairperson and 23 members including one Member Secretary ex-officio who is

Administrative officer of CARA. The Meeting of Advisory Committee was held on 7th June at MWCD and an orientation programme held on 6th June 2018 in CARA.

Agenda Items and Decisions (Programme Matters):

Agenda Item 1: Transfer of NRI PAPs from one country to another.

8. CEO CARA informed that there are many NRI Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAPs) who are residing in other country on work permit and while waiting for referral after registering for adoption, some of them had to shift back to India or some other country as per the requirement of their job. These PAPs have requested CARA to consider their cases relaxing the requirement of stay of one year as per the Habitual place of Residence defined in Section 2 (38) of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. They being Indian citizens and having right to get all benefits extended to the citizens, may be permitted to register immediately without waiting for one year (even those who may not have registered while residing abroad).

Decision:

9. The case may be processed on file for examining by the Ministry as it is a policy matter.

Agenda Item 2: Suggestion received from Mr. Avinash Kumar, Member, Steering Committee of CARA.

10. CEO CARA informed that Mr. Avinash Kumar has given the suggestions for management of siblings in need of care and protection which has been attached as Annexure with the agenda.

11. Suggestions have been noted.

Agenda Item 3: Recommendation of the Committee Constituted to Review the Categorization of Special Needs Children for Better Management and facilitating their adoptions.

12. CEO, CARA informed that a meeting with the Expert Committee on Categorisation of the Special Need Children was held on 24 May, 2018 under the Chairmanship of Prof. Sheffali Gulati, AIIMS and NOC Expert Member of CARA. The Committee recommended reorganisation of current sub categories of physically and mentally challenged under the Special Needs category for the Children has been given with a proposal to have 15 subcategories, which are better indicative of child's needs. Further, CEO CARA informed that the report contained the amended Schedule XVIII (classification of Special Needs children for purpose of adoption) and Schedule III (MER). JS(FA) stated that parents are not aware as to what the Special Needs of the child would be in the existing categorisation and hence, the implementation of the recommendations of the report will result in transparency as the PAPs will be better informed. Ms. Kavita Srivastava, Technical Director, NIC suggested that a 15 second video of the child may also be uploaded on the adoption portal for each of the special needs children for better understanding of the child's persona.

Decision:

13. The Steering Committee recommended that the report given by the Expert Committee on Categorisation of the Special Need Children be moved on file for the Ministry to examine before it is approved.

Agenda Item 4: Information on the notification of the new Advisory

The CEO, CARA informed that the new notification for constitution of Advisory Committee of CARA consisting of 24 members including Chairperson and Member Secretary (one member from each State) has been notified by the Ministry. Chairperson of the Steering Committee stated that the North East has not been represented and few more members for representing the North East and other States not representing may be included subsequently.

Decision:

15. This was for information of the Steering Committee.

Agenda Item 5: Revision of financial norms for the Training and capacity building programmes of CARA (e.g. training(s)/ consultation(s)/ seminar(s)/ workshop(s)/ consultative meet(s) on adoption & related matters.

16. Agenda for Revision of financial norms was explained to the Committee by CEO CARA with a request for the approval of the proposal as it had not been revised for last years.

Decision:

17. The Steering Committee was of the view that the Honorarium recommended to be paid to the Resource Person is very less. This should be in line with the honorarium paid by other organisations to their resource person for such programmes. The matter should be reviewed and put up again to the Steering Committee. JS(FA) agreed to reducing the advance being given from 80% to 60% of the sanctioned amount and was of the view that the Administrative Charges and Contingent Expenditure should be clubbed together under one sub-head.

Agenda Item 6: Approval of series of Sponsored Radio Program (SRP) regarding adoption and related issues.

It was informed that CARA may consider making of Sponsored Radio Program (SRP) for dissemination on various radio channels across the country to have a wider advocacy program covering the far flung areas. This will be useful for promoting adoption and provide help in counselling of PAPs. National Film Division Corporation (NFDC) was contacted for production of 13 episodes of 15 minutes each. The total cost of production will be approximately Rs. 39.61 lakhs. Apart from this the cost of dissemination will be Rs. 60.18 lakh.

Decision:

19. Approved, subject to availability of fund. However, the Chairperson of the Committee directed that this work must be either under taken through DAVP (renamed as Bureau of Outreach) or directly with All Indian Radio (AIR).

Agenda Item 7: Media Activities Planned and Proposed during the year 2018-19.

20. The Chairperson of the Steering Committee was in view that the Media Section of the Ministry may be consulted for the production of the contents.

Decision:

21. The proposal was approved within the existing BE.

Agenda Item 8: Approval of Accounts for the Financial year 2017-2018.

22. The Financial Statement for the Financial Year 2017-2018 placed at Appendix 'J' was reviewed by the Steering Committee.

Decision:

23. Approved and the same be submitted to C & AG for audit as per Section 73 of the Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

24. CEO, CARA informed that the budget under the salary head for Rs. 2.45 Crores can met only 8 months salary. CARA requires Supplementary grant for Rs. 1.20 Crore under the Salary head. This includes Rs. 0.50 Crore for 7th CPC arrears. JS & FA suggest that Supplementary grants may be asked on implementation of 7th CPC in CARA. Chairperson of Steering Committee directed that approval of Ministry of Finance (MoF) for implementation of the 7th CPC for the employees of CARA be obtained immediately.

Decision:

25. Head wise allocation of BE was approved with the amendment that the allocation of funds under the purchase of stationery sub-head should be kept at Rs.6.00 lakhs instead of the proposed Rs. 9.00 lakhs. Approval for additional expenditure under this sub-head may be taken later if required.

Agenda Item 10: Purchase of Stationery during the financial year 2018-2019.

26. The Chairperson enquired about the expenditure on purchase of stationary for the previous financial year i.e. 2017-2018, which was Rs. 5.04 lakhs. Hence, the Committee gave approval for CEO CARA to incur expenditure on stationary upto Rs. 6.0 lakhs, during the current financial year. JS (FA) also suggested to maintain the printers and cartridges on centralised basis with provisioning of maintained managed services which would be economical.

Decision:

27. Approved subject to the reduction in the allocation of funds for purchase of stationery items from Rs.9,00,000/- to Rs. 6,00,000/-.
